

Stanley Milgram's Obedience to Authority: An Experimental View, published in 1974, is a short book that became a must-read text for behavioral scientists by dropping the following bombshell: Ordinary people will intentionally torture other people with agonizing electrical shocks if a man in a white lab coat tells them that it's all part of a learning experiment. Milgram managed to garner this information without actually shocking anyone. The "learners" being shocked were actors; the true subjects of the experiment were the "teachers"; and the experiment was designed to determine if any of the "teachers" could disobey the "experimenter's" order to proceed with the experiment once the "learners" began to scream in pain. Although Milgram's experiment has been attacked on ethical grounds by other social scientists, it has never been subjected to a legal analysis. In this essay, attorney Charles Carreon first strips away the scientific jargon Milgram used to sell his conclusion that humans are evolutionarily hardwired to obey immoral authority, showing how Milgram deceived both his experimental subjects and his scientific readers. Although Milgram claimed his data proved that good people will voluntarily commit evil acts from excessive reverence for authority, Carreon shows that Milgram merely demonstrated what we already knew -- that although authorities can induce their subordinates to perform evil acts, they are simply criminals, not legitimate authorities, and their followers are participants in crime. Carreon argues that Milgram's reliance on evolution to support his conclusion that humans are inherently obedient is a variant of original sin, i.e., original subservience. Carreon concludes that as members of a democratic society, we must reject Milgram's fatalistic view of human nature, resolve to make our own moral decisions, and free ourselves from the influence of corrupt, unlawful authority.
